COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND PROCEDURES

Social Distancing

- We will be practicing 6' 'social distancing' at all times while in the building.
- Floors and pews and doorways are marked appropriately to assist in maintaining the recommended distance from each other.
- Signs have been posted as needed to give clear direction and remind everyone of the social distancing requirements.

Contact Tracing

- If any attendee discovers that they test positive or comes in contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19 during the time of their attendance in our Sanctuary, it is expected and required that they inform Pastor Manigault immediately.
- Upon being informed that an attendee has tested positive or has been in contact with someone who tested positive with COVID-19 <u>during the time they attended our service</u>, the Pastor will immediately notify by phone, or text and/or email all attendees of this service of the potential exposure.
 - The name of the exposed individual will **NOT** be given to the attendees.
- Once so informed each attendee of the service is expected to contact the Dept of Public Health (DPH) and inform them of their status and follow the DPH plan of action, which may include selfquarantining for prescribed number of days and getting tested.

- Additionally, the Pastor will also provide to the Department of Health (DPH) the name and contact information of the known exposed individual in accordance with Massachusetts' COVID-19 contact tracing protocols.
- Upon the report of a potential exposure, our Sanctuary will be closed for at least 14 days from the day of this exposure notification.

Face Coverings

- Wearing of a mask during the service will be required of <u>all attendees</u>.
- Masks should be worn <u>except</u> when 'preaching' 'expediting', 'singing' or receiving communion.
 - When expediting, singing, preaching and/or communion are concluded, participants are asked to place their mask back over their mouth and nose.

Offering

 We will continue to utilize our online giving platform/mail in offering to receive our tithes and offerings

Communion

- We will continue to use the individually packaged bread and juice for the foreseeable future.
- Two designated servers who are masked and gloved will hand out communion packages to all desiring to participate in the Holy Communion, making sure not to contact recipients' hands.
- Once communion has been completed each person will dispose of the used package in a receptacle which will be provided by the Church.
